UNDERSTANDING HIGHER ED'S DEADLINE DATES

Salt River Higher Education (SRHE) has specific deadline dates that are year round. There are two sets of dates. Those dates are: <u>Academic</u> deadline dates and <u>Vocational</u> deadline dates. Let's see what the difference is for both.

The <u>Academic</u> deadline dates are <u>June 30th</u>, <u>November 30th</u> and <u>April 30th</u>. Examples of Academic schools include Mesa Community College or Arizona State University.

The <u>Vocational</u> deadline dates are <u>July 31st</u>, <u>Oct 31st</u>, <u>Jan 31st</u>, and <u>April 30th</u>. Examples of Vocational or Trade schools are Arizona College or Avalon School of Beauty.

All students receiving scholarship funding MUST reapply once a year to continue receiving it. Academic students reapply by June 30th and Vocational students reapply by July 31st. The other deadline dates are available for new or returning applicants who wish to begin classes throughout the year.

INCREASE YOUR CHANCES OF SUCCESS BY SETTING SMART GOALS

What does every successful person, from students to entrepreneurs to marathon runners, have in common? They set a goal, and that goal serves as a guide for their decisions and how to reach that goal. But not all goals are created equal. How you go about identifying and setting goals affects whether you can achieve them just as much as your action plan does. To make sure your goals are clear and reachable, each one should be:

- Specific (simple, sensible, significant).
